ABOUT THE THEME

A good environment to begin engaging children in missions is within your local NDI. Work with your local NDI President to share a mission lesson with the varying age groups during your Sunday School sessions. Let's make sure that these lessons are fun and interactive and that children have something to take home. Having a souvenir from each lesson, will help the children to remember the lessons months and years after.

Mission education amongst the children is vital. This is how they will know that becoming a missionary, locally or abroad, is possible, because there are others who have done it. DISTRICT NMI/NDI CONVENTION 2023

Our year began with the joint District NDI/NMI Convention on Saturday March 4, 2023. Thank you to St. James COTN for being such gracious hosts, providing breakfast for delegates and allowing us to partner with you for our outreach. Thank you to the worship leaders of the Santa Cruz COTN and to the speaker, Rev. Dr. Gregson Francis, PhD, for their excellent ministry. To all those who played a role in our Convention, especially the technical team, thank you!

Our theme for 2023 was "Being and Making Christlike Disciples in the Cities". During the afternoon session of the Convention, we took a hands-on approach to this theme by partnering with the St. James COTN's Hope Kitchen, in meeting a need in the capital and environs. Twenty (20) volunteers, consisting mostly of young persons, were able to reach out to approximately fifty (50) persons, with a meal and prayer. The feedback was heartwarming as lives were touched, both volunteers and recipients. Thank you to all our delegates who participated in the Convention. You made it a success.





Create an environment for missions to thrive in your local church!

PRAYER

1 Thessalonians 5:16 encourages us to pray without ceasing. As you pray, remember missions and missionaries.

Under the leadership of Min. Eva Woods, the District NMI encouraged active participation in prayer. As a District, we observed Regional and Global Prayer Initiatives including 40 days of prayer prior to Pentecost (Regional: April 19, 2023 – May 28, 2023), 40 days of prayer for the cities (Regional: January 1 – February 9, 2024) and Nazarene Global Week of Prayer (Global: February 25, 2024 – March 2, 2024). A children's edition was included in this year's Global week of prayer resources and I hope that we got our children involved. On Wednesdays, we would send out NMI Central, which is a weekly publication highlighting what is taking place in different countries, along with their prayer requests, and we sent out our Regional Prayer Line to our churches.

We were able to host two district prayer meetings. On Saturday June 1, 2023 under the theme "We are Better Together", one hundred and forty-one (141) households met online to prayer for our District, nation and our world. Rev. Cheryl Ann Cardinez delivered a powerful word. On Saturday November 25, 2023, under the theme "With Reverent Submission", sixty-six (66) persons gathered in person and seventy-six (76) households joined us online for our second District Prayer Meeting at the Felicity COTN. Our speaker was District Superintendent, Rev. Rian Williams and prayer was emphasized for the Persecuted Church.

Thank you to Pastor Darren Dinnoo for working alongside us to plan these two meetings. Thank you to Felicity COTN for being wonderful hosts and to our speakers, worship teams and technical teams. To all Pastors and leaders who prayed and supported our prayer meetings, may God bless you!

My heartfelt gratitude to you, Sis Eva, for your faithful, dedicated and distinguished leadership in NMI in our District over the past twenty-one (21) years. We love and appreciate your ministry, but more importantly, we love and appreciate you!

2 Corinthians 8:7 "See that you also excel in this grace of giving". As you give to different ministries, remember that our missionaries need your love gift to WEF to do their work without added burdens.

GIVING (CONTINUED)

• World Evangelism Fund (WEF)

Just as Tithes and Offerings support the work of the local church, your giving to WEF supports the work of the Global church. As local churches encourage their members to give tithes to do the work of the church in their community, NMI encourages local churches to give 5.5% to WEF so that Christlike disciples can be made in the nations. We are working towards becoming a Zero Zeroes District – a district where there are no churches with zero contributions to WEF each year.

In 2023, **twenty-two (22) churches** gave **\$150,713.33** to the World Evangelism Fund. (Bethany, Canaan, Cochrane, Cocorite, Couva, Cumuto, D'Abadie, Dibe, Dow Village, El Bethel, El Socorro, Five Rivers, Guanapo, La Platta, NHC, NWC, Point Fortin, San Fernando, Sangre Grande, St. James, Tunapuna, Vance River). **Eight (8)** of these churches were able to meet their 5.5% WEF goal - Cocorite, Couva, Cumuto, Dibe, Dow Village, El Bethel, San Fernando, Sangre Grande. I wish to thank all of these churches! Attached to our reports is a fact sheet about WEF as well as stories of how the Church is growing because of your giving to WEF.

In 2023, we were able to transfer **US \$68,393.00 (TT\$ 465,072.12)** to the Global COTN for WEF. Thank you to Caribbean Nazarene College (CNC), for your continued partnership with us in making these transactions.

Alabaster

Alabaster giving is the lifeline through which the construction aspect of our global mission effort is accomplished. Giving to Alabaster allows the WEF to remain intact for other uses.

Last year, the global Church of the Nazarene celebrated 75 years of Alabaster giving and began a year-long emphasis on Alabaster from June 2023 - June 2024. Videos were produced and released monthly, highlighting Alabaster stories across the world. We shared these with our local churches.

In 2023, **fourteen (14) churches** contributed \$38,300.00 to Alabaster, compared to \$20,480.00 received in 2022. Thank you to these churches. (Canaan, Cochrane, Couva, Dibe, Dow Village, El Socorro, Guanapo, La Platta, NWC, Sangre Grande, Santa Cruz, St. James, Tunapuna, Vance River)

GIVING (CONTINUED)

Fundraising

As we continue on giving, the District NMI held a few fundraisers last year. Our main fundraiser, however, was our Emancipation Day "Freedom in Christ" Boat Cruise. This cruise sailed from The Anchorage, Chaguaramas, with ministry by gospel artistes, DJ Christchild, Blessed Messenger and Jaron Nurse. Other highlights were the 360 photo booth and the fashion show. We sold ninety-nine (99) tickets to Nazarenes and non-Nazarenes. We broke even, however, the cruise was well enjoyed and was a great time of fellowship for those who attended. We endeavor to make this an annual fundraiser. Thank you to Rev. Louise Frederick-Bobb for the fantastic work done in this area.

• District NMI Operation

Twenty-four (24) churches paid their DNMI Budget in 2023. Thank you! (Arima, Canaan, Cochrane, Cocorite, Couva, Cumuto, D'Abadie, Dibe, Dow Village, El Bethel, El Socorro, Felicity, Five Rivers, Guanapo, Lowlands, Holiness Centre, Oropune, Piarco, San Fernando, Sangre Grande, St. James, Tunapuna, Valencia, Vance River). Thank you for empowering us to serve you better and equip you with the resources and tools needed for NMI to be vibrant in your churches. The Treasurer's Report will provide details of our receipts and payments in 2023.

As I share on the DNMI's operation, allow me to thank our Vice President, Sis Selina Dass for holding down the fort in my absence and for her teachable spirit and commitment to NMI. I also want to express thanks to our Secretary, Sis Janice Bastaldo for her faithful, timely service in preparing minutes, submitting forms to the Regional Office, making calls on my behalf and so much more. To our Treasurer, Sis Cecilia Hutson, who makes herself available and executes her service with professionalism and excellence, thank you!

ENGAGING CHILDREN AND YOUTH

Mark 9:37 "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me does not welcome me but the one who sent me." Welcome children and youth in missions!

Children Ministry

NMI continues to invest in our District's children and youth. Opportunities are provided for them throughout the year at the local and District levels to get involved. **We need you to encourage them to be a part of these activities.** Two of our main activities with children as a District this year were our children's Cross Cultural Orientation (CCO) and our Alabaster Box making competition. I thank Sis Carol Garner-Dupigny for her commitment and efforts in this area.

ENGAGING CHILDREN AND YOUTH (CONTINUED)

On April 13, 2023, we visited our District Children's Bible Camp in Arouca to open the eyes of our children to mission work and missionaries. We shared the story of our Bajan missionary, Danielle Miller - The Girl from the Pine and had a time of crafting. Sis Keisha Alexis-Blaise delivered the story so well that she kept the fifty-three (53) campers and four (4) additional children attentive and interacting.

In the month of August, we promoted our Alabaster Box Making Competition for children. We received twenty-one (21) submissions from children in five churches (Arima, Canaan, NWC, Dibe and La Platta). The submissions were judged by our Care and Connection missionaries, the Radis and our missionaries assigned to CNC, the Manswells. The winners of the competition, receiving book vouchers of \$500, \$350 and \$250 respectively were David Collymore (Dibe), Sumaiya Wadi (Arima) and Zhayne-Calil Cowie-Clarke (Canaan). Congratulations to all our children who took part. I am sure they enjoyed doing the boxes and the end results were really impressive! Thank you to the District NDI, Sis Keisha Alexis-Blaise, the Radis, the Manswells, our entrants and the parents and local Presidents who worked with their children to participate.

• Mission Mobilization (MM)

Mission mobilization outreaches are open to everyone, however, a particular emphasis is placed on getting youth to volunteer to serve in these missions. On Saturday August 22, 2023, our MM Coordinator, Sis Deanedra Joseph-Francis spearheaded our District Back to School Drive, engaging sixteen (16) youthful Nazarene volunteers. This event ministered to approximately forty (40) children at church and ninety (90) children in the community and was sponsored by generous Nazarenes across our District. Thank you to all those who volunteered to serve and those who participated through sponsorship. Thank you to the La Platta COTN for allowing us to do this initiative and to Sis Joseph-Francis for her efforts in this area.

Three persons from our District attended the Cross Cultural Orientation from April 8-10, 2023 to be trained in Cross Cultural Ministry and one person participated in a mission trip to St. Lucia in July 2023.

• Genesis Initiative

Genesis is an Initiative of the Mesoamerica Region to plant churches in the cities on our Region. Young people are being called to serve in the cities. Let us support them.

ENGAGING CHILDREN AND YOUTH (CONTINUED)

In the month of January, NMI emphasized the Genesis initiative. We highlighted former Genesis Missionary and friend to our District, Cleon Cadogan, by producing a Mission Education lesson and video. Churches were encouraged to promote Genesis, pray for and collect an offering for the initiative. Some of our churches took the initiative to invite Cleon to share in their NMI Sessions. Thank you to all our churches who collected the Genesis offering over the past years. Let us continue to pray and give to this great work.

EDUCATING

The District NMI Council understands the importance of Mission Education in local churches as a primary tool to inspire others to get involved. As such, we continuously resource our local churches with stories and general information.

Telling the Story

To tell the story, we have produced twelve mission education lessons for the period under review. These were done by local authors, highlighting mission work in the Caribbean and by Caribbean people and are designed for use in children ministry, youth ministry and adult ministry. In addition, we encourage everyone to subscribe to NMI Central, as they would provide stories weekly and in May 2023, they began to produce a monthly kids segment called Kids Kaleidoscope. We also continued to tell the story regularly on social media. We are currently on Facebook (NMI T&T), YouTube (NMI T&T) and in 2023, we joined Instagram with the handle @nmittdistrict. We also continue to update our website with resources (www.dnmitt.com).

Thank you to our churches who used the Mission Education lessons and gave feedback. My gratitude extends to Rev. Donnamie Ali for being the editor of our Mission Education lessons and to our authors Sis Janice Bastaldo, Sis Selina Dass, Sis Carol Garner-Dupigny, Bro Leonard Grant, Sis Shelly Ann Hope, Rev. Donnamie Ali, Sis Lenetta Cowie-Clarke and Sis Shannon Rampersad. Thank you to our video editors, graphic designers, and broadcast team for all their work in 2023 and a big Thank you to Sis Shannon Rampersad for her dedication to the task and availability to do more when called upon.

Local NMI Leaders Training

To keep our Presidents up to date and to provide training for new persons, we held a workshop on May 20, 2023 at the Dow Village Nazarene Victory Chapel for Pastors, local NMI Presidents and local NMI Councils. The sessions were interactive and those in attendance had a lot of fun, more than was planned, whilst learning about NMI. We

explored the basics, practical applications, expectations and challenges. **Seventy two (72) persons** attended the workshop in person and there were six (6) Persons who joined us virtually from Tobago. This workshop displayed the creativity of our NMI leaders and I thank them for being a part. Thank you to the Dow Village Nazarene Victory Chapel for being great hosts and to Sis Selina Dass and Sis Janice Bastaldo for their assistance in planning and preparing for this workshop.

• Missional Rally

We were back in person for our missional Rally this year. What a wonderful time we had. It was held on September 24, 2023 under the theme "Love Poured Out". Thank you to the 141 persons who joined us at the Arima COTN for this Rally. Features of this Rally included worship by the Santa Cruz COTN, a drama piece by the Dibe COTN youths which focused on Alabaster creating spaces for people to worship, heal and learn, the announcement of the winners of our Alabaster Box making competition, the Alabaster Box Display, greetings from our Global NMI President, Sis Christine Trent-Mosuela and our Regional NMI Coordinator, Sis Ana Crocker de Diaz, a wonderful rendition of "I Speak Jesus" by the Guanapo COTN, Alabaster videos from across the world, writing cards of affirmation to our Pastors, the Alabaster Jar exchange, the preached word by Rev. Dr. Anthony Manswell, celebrating the Manswell's 20 years of Missionary Service in Trinidad and Tobago, tokens and giveaways and much more. It was a time of inspiration, encouragement, education and fun. To everyone who took part and attended, I am so thankful for each of you.

3 John 5 "Dear friend, you are faithful in what you are doing for the brothers and sisters, even though they are strangers to you." Even though we don't know our missionaries personally, let us be faithful in praying, giving and educating about them.

• Care And Connection (C&C)

In 2023, we were assigned to C&C missionaries – the Radziszewskis (Radis) who are currently serving in Argentina. We introduced them to our District via a live interview in January 2023 and on June 10, 2023, we had the pleasure of meeting the Radis in person at Global NMI Convention. They are such loving, wonderful, amazing people. We presented gifts for our missionaries (past and present) at the Global NMI Convention and liaised with them and prayed for them throughout the year. I must thank our Genesis & Care and Connection Coordinator, Sis Shelly Ann Hope, for her dedicated service over the past year! Her contributions have been invaluable.

MISSIONARY CARE (CONTINUED)

We said farewell to the Radis last year and welcomed new C&C missionaries this year - the Mutowas of South Africa. We released a video of our interview with them a week ago. Show it in your churches and share it so that everyone can know who they are and begin praying for them.

On a local level, we saw a significant increase in participation in the programme. **Twenty eight (28)** of our 31 churches did the work of connecting with and hosting their C&C Pastors virtually. Thank you Pastors and Presidents! I encourage you to continue this good work in 2024. New Care and Connection assignments have been assigned and can be found in your packages.

• Spanish Ministry Coordinators

Tim and Neli Bertrand: In April 2023, Tim and Neli Bertrand, of the US and Mexico (serving in the Kansas District), were deployed to serve as Spanish Ministry Coordinators based at the Arima Church of the Nazarene. Tim and Neli are sponsored missionaries, meaning they raise their own funds to take care of their needs over a two year period. My family and I were happy to be a part of their special welcome on April 16. We quickly introduced them to our District on May 8 through a live interview on Facebook and YouTube. At our District workshop in May, we invited them to share with us on the World Evangelism Fund and how important it is to the COTN. A love offering was collected for the couple at this workshop in excess of \$2000. As the welcoming district, we connected with them during the year to ensure they were comfortable and felt cared for.

Missionaries to CNC

Revs. Anthony and Barbara Manswell: In January 2003, our District welcomed the Manswells to serve as missionaries to Caribbean Nazarene College (CNC). 2023 marked 20 years of faithful, loving missionary service by this family so we wanted to share a bit of their journey and celebrate their impact on our District. We interviewed the couple on May 22 and invited Dr. Anthony Manswell to preach at our Missional Rally, where we took the opportunity to recognize their tremendous contributions. The Manswells also judged our Alabaster competition in 2023.

• Missionaries to Spain

Matthew Lawrence and Family: We received wonderful news in January 2024. Our very own Matthew Lawrence and his family are being deployed as missionaries to Spain, where they will work with the migrant population through compassionate care and sports Evangelism. They are currently on home assignment raising funds for the ministry and will begin their ministry in Spain in May 2024.

As Matthew's home district, we felt it was necessary for us to show our love and support for this young man and his family in a tangible way. Our churches were asked to collect an offering for him in February 2024 and the total collected will be shared with you at the next opportunity.

• Missionaries to Dominica - Work and Witness

Every year, we send missionaries to do a short term mission trip in the Caribbean. During the pandemic, the team was unable to go. However, last year, our District Work and Witness Team completed their three year stint to Dominica from August 10–21, 2023, following a sending service at the Couva COTN on August 6, 2023. All glory to God! On this trip, the team of sixteen (16) persons worked on the manse of the Bioche COTN and were able to complete the outer walls, inner walls and ring beams. The team also did outreach in the community at night. I continue to applaud this team, ably led by Bro Courtney Greene, for their countless sacrifices and selfless service to others. Thank you to our District Work and Witness Team.

At Global NMI Convention 2023, Work and Witness was rebranded and is now a part of Nazarene Mission Teams.

Let us continue to keep our own missionaries, their families and their ministries in our prayers. Reach out to them from time to time and give them some encouragement.

STATUS OF LOCAL NMIS: REBUILDING THE WALLS

My greatest desire is to see NMI vibrant and alive in all our churches. As I present my final report to you, I urge you to create an environment in your churches for missions to thrive. NMI cannot thrive in your church if it does not have a space to do so.

Nazarene churches should be actively praying for missions and missionaries, because we understand that we are a global church, called to fulfil the Great Commission. Nazarene churches should be giving to the World Evangelism Fund, so that our missionaries' needs, theological institutions' needs and ministry needs can be met and the lost can be reached. Nazarene churches should be educating about missions, because our members, young and old, are much more likely to accept the call to be a missionary once they have heard how others have done it. Nazarene churches should be raising up a new generation of missionaries, both local and global, through engagement in missions from a tender age, because the harvest is ripe and the labourers are few. Again, create an environment for missions to thrive in your local church.

Our Zonal Coordinators were few this year, however, they did well. Thank you Sis Selina Dass (East and South Zone) and Bro Quincy Crooks (Tobago) for a job well done! I took up the challenge of working with the North Zone.

Our District NMI Council shares a good relationship with our Pastors and Presidents. We appreciate them very much. We know that different churches have different challenges. However, barring the challenges that were faced over the years, reports from our local churches continue to be encouraging. Reports received show that thirty (30) of our churches prayed for missions, twenty-three (23) of our churches submitted offerings to the District NMI (not including District Budget), twenty- four (24) of our churches educated on missions through

Mission Education Lessons, videos or special speakers, twenty-three (23) of our churches engaged children and youth in missions.

DISTRICT NMI TREASURER

TREASURER'S REPORT - JANUARY 1ST 2023 TO DECEMBER 31ST 2023

Mr. Chairman/District Superintendent, Rev. Rian Williams, District NMI and NDI Presidents Sis. Leigh Hope and Sis Cindy Ann Collymore respectively, Council Members of both NMI and NDI, Pastors, Delegates and Friends. I greet you in the Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. It is a privilege for me to present my report for the period 1st January 2023 –31st December 2023.

RECEIPTS

In 2023, the Trinidad and Tobago District NMI raised income in the sum of Two Hundred and Sixty Nine Thousand, Four Hundred and Eighty Dollars and Fifty-Four Cents (TT \$269,480.54) which represented an increase of Twenty Three Percent (23%) over receipts for the corresponding period in 2022. Of that sum, One Hundred and Fifty Thousand, Seven Hundred and Thirteen Dollars and Thirty-Three Cents (\$150,713.33) represented receipts toward World Evangelism Fund (WEF) a decrease of two percent (2%). However, it should be noted that a few churches paid their WEF budgets at the end of December 2023 and same will be reported on in 2024 since the payments were not captured during this reporting period.

PAYMENTS

Payments for 2023 amounted to **Five Hundred and Forty Nine Thousand, Two Hundred and Seventy-Two Dollars and Seventy-Five Cents (TT \$549,272.75)**. Of that sum, Four Hundred and Sixty Five Thousand and Seventy Two Dollars and Thirteen Cents (\$465,072.13) or approximately **(US \$68,393)** represented transfers of funds to the Global NMI.

Cosmas received God's calling in 1982 and did theological education in Swaziland where he obtained a Bachelor of Theology degree offered Canadian Nazarene College (Ambrose University). He graduated in 1988 and then took up pastoral work back home in Harare, Zimbabwe for two years, after which he was ordained in the year 1990. He was then asked to join the teaching

staff of Nazarene Bible College where he taught and served as College treasurer. In 1993, he was appointed to serve as Vice Principal, a position he held until he left for Kenya to attend Africa Nazarene University. At ANU, he studied a Master of Arts in Religion and received the degree in the year 1999. Rev. Mutowa later completed his second Masters Theology degree (Compassionate Ministry and Humanitarian/Development Practices) from NTC, Manchester, United Kingdom. Andronica has a diploma in Theology from Swaziland Nazarene Bible College and a Bachelors of Commerce in Financial Management from the University of South Africa. Andronica is a third Generation Nazarene.

Cosmas has served in various ministries of the church including coordinating Extension education in Zimbabwe, coordinating Nazarene Communication work in Zimbabwe (after attaining an advanced Christian broadcaster's diploma). He also pastored a multicultural church in Harare, for 9 years, as well as served the church in the Nazarene Compassionate Ministries as country coordinator for Zimbabwe.

In 2006, the Mutowas were appointed to serve as Regional missionaries in Malawi where Cosmos' role was that of Mission Coordinator for Malawi. While in Malawi Cosmos was asked take additional responsibility as Interim President of Nazarene Theological College of Central Africa.

Cosmas served on the Regional Advisory Council for Africa Region and as member of General Board of the Church of the Nazarene. Cosmas served at the Africa Regional Office from 2008 to 2020 as Nazarene Compassionate Ministries Africa Regional Coordinator and as Executive Director for Helping Hands Africa. Andronica is serving as Africa Region Secretary and does Pensions, Insurance, and credentials. Cosmas is currently serving in the Nazarene Compassionate Ministries International Office as NCM Education and Church Engagement Coordinator. The Mutowas are based in Johannesburg, South Africa.

STORIES & ENCOURAGEMENTS

from Regional Reports at Global NMI Convention 2023

- Charity Shunnaman is a missionary in Thailand assigned to Myanmar. Millions have been moving from Myanmar to Thailand due to civil war. The Banchelon Bethesda COTN set in heart of Bangkok district became a safe place for persons making the transition. A diaspora church pastor was concerned about Myanmar kids in Thailand and their life on the move. They couldn't go to school. So the church started a new mission called "New creation Centre" a safe place for kids down the street. The church did not have any budget for this but all their needs were provided and children came. Teachers volunteered. The children are not Christians yet but the door is opening wider.
- In one of the remote districts of Papua New Guinea, there is a large youth population. This area is so remote, you can only use light or small aircraft to get to it. It's a rugged terrain. Youths in this area walked for 2-3 days through the forest for a 5-day youth congress. At this congress, thousands repented and gave life to Christ. The fire in the youths continued. When they returned home, they uprooted their cannabis plantations and threw away idols and witchcraft items. They threw away their gambling cards, fathers sought forgiveness from their children and youths sought forgiveness from their parents. Praise the Lord!
- The Asia-Pacific Region has begun the SENT initiative Strategically Engaged Nazarene Teams for overseas workers across the world. Overseas workers are trained and equipped to start churches wherever their job takes them. In the past 2 years, the Micronesia field started has 4 districts!!! The Melanesia Field started 3 districts in 2 years! The 6 year old COTN in Mongolia has seven organized churches with over 30 preaching points.

In South America, church planting Pastor, Pastor Manuel, would take 8-9 hours by boat each day to get from one place to another to plant a church. He planted a church in 2019 and four years later, the congregation is at 400 persons and they have since planted 20 more churches.

The COTN in Africa started in Brava, Cape Verde 120 years ago. It was started in Africa by Africa. In 1980, the COTN was in 9 African countries. Today it is present in 44 countries.

- Pastor Jodi Combi, who began ministry at Medford Life Path, started with about 10 persons over 70 years old. In four years, that church grew over 100 persons.
- Dr. Pascal Permis from Indiantown, Florida, was part of a Haitian church-planting church, which grew from 2 Haitian churches to 35 on the South Florida District.
- Pastor Craig Coulter of Oro Valley, Arizona. His church had been there for over 20 years. Now they are bringing in 100 new Nazarenes every quarter. This past Easter, they had over 10,000 persons.
- Oxford is a small town in Canada of about 1000 persons. 100 persons were coming to the church. Pastor Jodi Getson pastored Oxford Naz with about 100 members. When COVID hit, she set up a studio and started a Facebook ministry. The church doubled, and then it exploded. From 100 people in-person to 10,000 on Facebook. During the pandemic, 1,500 persons across the world were doing devotions together. Reports were received of people getting saved after hearing Pastor Getson and starting Nazarene churches in their living rooms all across the world.

Despite the war in Ukraine, the COTN in that area is three times larger now than it was before the war. \$3.5M US dollars was given from Nazarene Compassionate Ministries to provide relief.

A border crossing ministry was set up in Poland to help people transition. The COTN was there from Day 1, carrying bags and helping however they could.

An Arab Learning Center, in partnership with European Nazarene College, was set up in Cyprus, to train Arab leaders across the world to help the Arab population come to Christ. Cyprus was strategically chosen because everyone can get a visa to go there.





DISTRICT NDI PRESIDENT

REPORTING PERIOD: JANUARY 1, 2023 - DECEMBER 31, 2023

District Superintendent, Rev Rian Williams, District NMI President, Sis Leigh Hope, Feature Speaker Rev. Patricia Derry, Pastors, District leaders, Local NDI Presidents Delegates, Members and Friends. Allow me to present my 12th and final report as the chair for this fundamental ministry of the Church of the Nazarene the Nazarene Discipleship International (NDI) formally the Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI). CARIBBEAN FIELD LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

STATUS OF NDI

This is the stewardship report for NDI Children's Ministries for the district of Trinidad and Tobago. It reflects children-focused initiatives and activities led by myself, as well as other District Children's Ministry Leaders for the 2023 Church year.

NDI CONVENTION 2023 - EMPHASIS

The District NDI started our church year by intentionally joining our District Leadership in the rebuilding of the walls of our District in Discipleship. At our 2023 NDI Convention, special emphasis was placed on re-engaging our kids in our churches. In addition to hosting a kidsfocus center with worship, story segments, crafts, and other activities during the Convention, I led a workshop session entitled "REACHING OUR KIDS EQUIPPING THEM FOR THE JOURNEY" that engaged delegates on:

- Who are we reaching and why?
- What are the various Children's Ministries within the Church of the Nazarene?
- How can we develop these programs at our local churches?
- Where can we find tools and resources for developing local Children's ministries?

This session encouraged local leaders to once again ignite the ministries for the kids in their church communities and hopefully, guided them to the support systems and resources that are available to develop or improve their local ministries.

We thank God for continually calling persons to serve in the District Children's ministries. This year we experienced vibrant and dedicated leadership in our District Children's Bible Quiz and Children's Bible Easter Camp.

CHILDREN'S BIBLE CAMP

Sister Curlanne Archie, our 2023 Children's Camp Director, "counted it all joy" as she was joined by nineteen (19) counselors and two (2) auxiliary staff to lead a camp of fifty-three (53) campers, supported by Sis. Cindy-Ann Collymore and I.

Children's Bible Camp was held from April 9th to 14th 2023 at the Victory Heights Bible Camp site in Five Rivers Arouca. The theme for Children's Bible Camp 2023 was "Keepers of the Kingdom". This was a fitting theme for the many challenges that our children; and youth face today. The children learned that they can be a part of God's kingdom through salvation in his Son, Jesus; can be equipped with the armour of God to become 'Keepers of the Kingdom'; and can stand strong in today's battle for truth. It was wonderful to see our kids embrace that it's okay to be different and to stand out in their schools, homes, communities, and churches for God.

This camp was our first since the reopening of the country's COVID-19 pandemic. It was quite a unique experience with some new challenges of its own, but praise be to God, our camp was indeed a success.

We thank the counselors and staff who came from Nazarene Worship Centre, St. James, DowVillage, Sangre Grande, Vance River, Valencia, Five Rivers, and Point Fortin. We also thank the parents who entrusted us with their children, our church membership who visited and donated foodstuff, and our Corporate Sponsors (Universal Foods, J&A Express Meats Limited, Nestle Trinidad, and Kiss Baking Company) for their generous donations.

In planning for this camp, we launched by faith. Not truly knowing how many counselors and kids would attend in this post-COVID period. Our faithful God did it again. In addition to the physical and spiritual victories, we were also blessed with a financial breakthrough. We collected \$28,700 in camp fees, which was sufficient to cover our expenses of \$18,043 with a surplus of \$11,607. The excess allowed us to pay the \$3,200 downpayment for this year's 2024 Easter Camp.

We will cherish the experiences shared at this camp, which culminated with the traditional Banquet for the Kids. The Hall was nicely adorned by our dear Sister Archie (now deceased), whose unwavering love and service linger in our memories.

Thank you, Sister Curlanne, for your drive and overcoming spirit that keep you laboring in His vineyard.

CHILDREN'S BIBLE QUIZ

Reverend Alvilene Williams, our District Children's Bible Studies & Quiz Events Director, championed our District Children's Bible quiz ministry, which stood the test of time through the COVID-19 period. She reported that Children's Bible Studies and Quiz Events in the Trinidad and Tobago District continue to thrive due to the dedication of coaches, students, and parents who remain committed to prioritizing the study of God's word in their local churches.

The books studied during the 2023 1 & 2 Samuel for the 2022-2023 cycle and Matthew for the 2023-2024 cycle. Fifty-two (52) quizzers represented nine (9) churches - Arima, Canaan, Dibe, Guanapo, Lowlands Nazarene House of Praise, Nazarene Worship Centre, Point Fortin, Sangre Grande and St. James - in the competition. We were happy to welcome Point Fortin who joined for the first time in September. We held four (4) quiz meets including a District final in July and awarded medals and certificates for their participation in quiz meets.

Another significant highlight was that for the first time in three (3) years, an in-person quiz meet was held during the Children's Easter camp. The Tobago quiz team made a strong showing for this event and the kids had the opportunity to interact with the other campers.

The district promoted and had the intention to fully participate in the World Quiz event held at the Nazarene General Assembly. Eight (8) quizzers along with coaches and parents from Arima, Canaan, Guanapo, and St. James, were set to go. However, due to setbacks associated with the visa application process and fundraising, this initiative was not fully realized. We were fortunate to have one representative in the person of Zoe Williams from the Arima Church of the Nazarene together with two other quizzers from the Barbados District, who represented the Caribbean. Reverend Williams and her daughter Zoe, reported that they had memorable and impacting experiences during their visit to the quiz meet. The NDI will continue to encourage our quizzers to participate in future regional and/or global quiz events.

A Pastry Sale was held at the 2023 NDI/NMI Convention to assist with expenses for quizzers who were to travel to the global event. We were able to raise \$3,055 from the sale. Due to the setbacks with the travel plans, all the funds were retained for local quiz ministry use.

We express special thanks to Reverend Alvilene, and Sister Tashanique, who assisted her during the past year in executing her responsibilities. We also appreciate our coaches whose labor of love has not gone

unnoticed. Further, we applaud Sisters Kersha Garner and Gellen Matthews-Yarde, who hosted the quiz competitions. Finally, we thank all the kids and supporting parents who participated. We know that the word of God will continue to be a lamp unto their feet and a light unto their path.

To those who've past the Children's qualifying age group, we encourage you to quiz on! The District NYI also has a vibrant quiz program that would continue to engage you in learning God's word through Bible Quizzing.



General Convention 2023 began long before our arrival in Indiana, with online meetings with District NDI Presidents and delegates from the Caribbean Field Region.

At our online meetings, we were given an overview as to what to expect at General Convention 2023. One notable thing for me was that persons unable to attend physically were able to access the workshops online. It meant that more persons had access to information, that can then be shared with the wider community. Delegates were encouraged to access at least six (6) workshops before arrival but were free to avail themselves to more.

I found the topics for the online workshops to be very informative, interesting and relevant. My role in the NDI is with the Adult Ministries as well as Children's Ministries, and as such, I sought out workshops in these areas, although most came from fields outside the Mesoamerica Region.

There were a few topics that really stood out to me, although all were great. Topics such as Discipleship as a Life Journey, Christian Couples Ministry, Holiness – a Lifestyle, (Africa), Discipling Children by Including Them (Mesoamerica), Mentoring Women, A Way of Praying (USA/Canada) and Discipleship with Children (Asia Pacific).

Although I was able to complete thirteen (13) workshops, I did view many other topics. What I observed was that as Adult Ministries was concerned, there were no workshops geared towards Men's Ministry.

Being an attendee at the actual Convention was an awesome experience. It was my second (2nd) time attending General Convention. And the experience was just as beautiful. Everywhere one went the theme "Jesus is Lord!" was visible. There was no denying that Jesus was indeed Lord. Experiencing Nazarenes from around the world fellowshipping, greeting each other, just smiling and excited, was one to remember for all times. Of all the workshops I attended, #1 above was most memorable. It spoke to the Journey of Grace – the way forward. It highlighted the fact that we are not "Lone Rangers," and therefore cannot go it alone.. we are all important to each other as we embark and continue on this journey.

But more than that, the speaker, Sis. Jenee Noreiga, shared about her life. A life of abuse, abuse, abuse and more abuse. As if this was not enough, there was jail, prison, drugs and babies. And a man who somehow stood by her side even though they got separated on several occasions. They did drugs together, separated. Had children, but separated every time. Went of to different jails, but somehow accidentally reconnected. She had her children taken from her, but somehow got them back. Promised to get off the streets and drugs, but went right back. Sis. Noreiga went on to share that the final straw was when after having her last child, she left the child in a car to go into a store to steal milk. She was caught. It was at this point she fell on her knees and cried out to God. But her arrest did not stop her. Although she cried out to God, upon her release, she went back to her old ways after just two (2) weeks. She had no where to go and no one to turn to. On her journey downhill, she kept remembering a nurse saying to her, "I love you." This was at the birth of her last child. The woman never condemned her, never judged her. One day whilst wondering around, she found herself in a shelter run by the Church of the Nazarene. And guess who welcomed her! Yes. The nurse, who continued to showm her love. Because of the love she received, Jenee Noreiga finally surrendered her life to God. She was saved. But it wasn't just the love and compassion of the nurse, it was the love of God that saved Sis. Noreiga.

BUT, what had me amazed was the revelation that God is real. Not that I didn't believe that he was real. I know that He is real. He always has a plan and He loves us regardless. But the testimony of Sis. Noreiga, just reconfirmed it.

The March of the Nations was another memorable time for me, as well as the segment where representatives from the Mesoamerica Region took the spotlight. Sis.Shelly Ann Hope and Sis. Shannon Rampersad, respectively carried the national flag of Trinidad and Tobago.

World Quiz was yet another feature of Convention. Our representative, Sis. Zoe Williams copped gold in her age group.

The Quadrennial Address on June 12th, 2023 was delivered by Dr. Carla Sunberg, the lone female on the Board of General Superintendent, who began her presentation by reminding us that "The King was in the Room! And that Jesus was Lord!"

"GOOD MORNING! The sun never goes down the the morning, thus the sun of the Church of the Nazarene is just above the horizon." Dr. Sunberg reminded us of the words of Dr. Phineas F. Bresee as he described the Church.
